
Mandatory Summer Watering Schedule



RESTRICTIONS EFFECTIVE JUNE 1 - SEPT. 30





Did you know the City of Lacey's daily water usage increases from about 6 million to 13 million gallons a day from June–September?

Since 2006, the City of Lacey has enforced an odd-even outdoor watering schedule for ALL its customers to help meet peak summer demand.

PLEASE NOTE:

Failure to follow the outdoor watering policy could ultimately lead to the discontinuation of your water service.

Even though we've had more than our share of rain this year, we still need to watch our summer water usage.

Why? Outdoor watering of lawns & gardens!

When a large number of households water their lawns and gardens at the same time, it can cause stress on the water distribution system. This could ultimately force the City to prematurely expand the water distribution and storage systems, which could result in a rate increase for Lacey Water Customers.



If you require additional watering, you must apply for a temporary exemption.

Planted a new lawn (sod or seed).

Planted a new landscaped area (trees or shrubs).

Have an irrigation system that waters areas on both sides of the street at the same time.

Exceptions to the schedule that do not require prior city approval include:

NO WATERING ON FRIDAYS

Outdoor potted plants and hanging baskets.

Plants growing inside of greenhouses (including commercial greenhouses).

Publicly-owned athletic fields.

Washing of cars and other vehicles.
